Servite Sisters Install New Leadership Team

The Ladysmith Servite Sisters installed a new leadership team for 2020–2024 during a Zoom gathering on Sept. 15.

Sister Mary Alice Willems, presider at the service, said, "Our predecessors could not have imagined a ceremony of this type even four years ago. Unfortunately, the pandemic necessitates it; fortunately, technology permits it."

The members of the new leadership team are Sisters Sean Fox, Theresa Sandok, and Barbara Thomalla.

Sister Sean is beginning her fourth consecutive term in leadership. She previously worked as an attorney in the Chicago area, where she provided legal services to the bereaved and elderly in settling estates, and with disabled family members in planning for the disabled person's care.

Sister Theresa has served as the order's president since 2000 and will continue in that role. She was a professor of philosophy and dean of the college of arts and sciences at Bellarmine University in Louisville, Ky., where she also served as director of the Thomas Merton Center.

Sister Barbara recently retired from her ministry as a public health nurse with St. Paul Ramsey County Public Health. She served two previous terms on the leadership team and now returns for a third term.

The sisters chose September 15 as the installation date because it is the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, a special day for Servites worldwide.

The telephone call came from out of the blue. It was Lexie, a former lifeguard at the pool where I swim regularly from 6-7 a.m. We would chat a bit each day, and sometimes she volunteered for community activities I was involved in.

Now, three years later, Lexie was a nursing student at St. Cloud University in Northern Minnesota. She asked if she and five other nursing students could do a Zoom interview with me for the final project of their Culture Groups class. "What's the topic?" I asked. "Different cultures were

suggested," she said, "and we chose the Nun culture." I was intrigued and agreed to do the interview on condition that I received the questions ahead of time. I told her I would send her my answers in advance so that we would all have a base of information to start with.

Lexie sent me 18 questions under the title "Servants of Mary Culture," beginning with: "What is your name?" and "Do you have any other names you go by?" The questions became increasingly more probing: "What culture(s) do

you belong to?" "What is your definition of a sister in the Servants of Mary culture?" "How did you become a part of this culture group?" "What do you feel is the most important thing about your culture?" I could see this was going to be an interesting interview.

Answering these questions prompted me to examine my 79 years of life through the various lenses of the many facets of being a nun. I discovered that I really had four different cultures all melded together: Family culture, Catholic culture, American culture, and Nun culture, which for me is the culture of religious life as lived through the charism of a Servant of Mary. Each of these cultures has marked me indelibly with particular traits, behaviors, customs, and values.

The six delightful women who interviewed me were not shy about asking questions or pressing me to expand on my written responses. I explained why I had two names, Cecilia Rose Fandel and Sister Mary Martin, and why I returned to my baptismal name. To do that I had to mention Vatican II and the new theology of religious life, in which becoming a nun is no longer seen as the start of a new life but as an extension of our life as baptized Christians.

I explained that a sister is someone who experiences an inner call from God to live her life for God. I told them about the many ways I had lived out this special call, starting out as a teacher in Catholic elementary schools, then as a social activist in Northern Wisconsin, and later as a community organizer in a poor, multicultural area of Chicago. I said that now that I'm back in Ladysmith I find myself challenged to help raise awareness and appreciation of the Native Americans on whose land we live and of the growing number of Hispanics who milk our cows, harvest our crops, and labor in our turkey, beef, and vegetable processing plants.

After the interview one of the students wrote to thank me for taking the time to help them with their project. She said, "Your knowledge and experiences will help shape us and our classmates' future as nurses. We're beyond blessed we were able to use you as a resource. I think each of us took something very valuable away from talking with you!"

Recently I emailed Lexie and asked how they did on their cultural project. She sent me a copy of their presentation and teacher evaluation. They received an A!

Sr. Mary Dominica Effertz was born in Weyerhaeuser, Wis. She entered religious life on June 19, 1948, and professed first vows on Aug. 16, 1950. She holds a BA in elementary education from Mount Senario College, Ladysmith, and an MA as a reading specialist from the University of Wisconsin-



Superior. She also attended the Institute of Religious Studies at St. Norbert College, De Pere, Wis. She served for 50 years as an elementary school teacher and music minister in Weirton, W.Va., and Almena, Ladysmith, Washburn, and Spooner, Wis. She also ministered as a hospice volunteer and pastoral visitor

to the sick and homebound. She is a spiritual assistant to Secular Servites and the Servite Lay Diakonia.

A memory I have to share ... is a two-week Servite pilgrimage to Italy in 1995 with about 25 of our sisters. We were blessed to have Fr. Peregrine Graffius, OSM, as our tour guide. My favorite place was Mount Senario, the site of the monastery near Florence where our Seven Holy Founders lived and the place of origin of our Servite Order in 1233.

Sr. Clarice (Mary Dolorosa) Gierzak

was born in Detroit, Mich. She entered religious life on Sept. 19, 1948, and professed first vows on Aug. 16, 1950. She holds a BA in elementary Education from Mount Senario College, Ladysmith, an MA in educational leadership and administration from the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, and an EdS in education and leadership from the University of St. Thomas, St. Paul, Minn. She also studied at the Duquesne University School of Music, Pittsburg, Pa. She ministered for 47 years as an elementary school

teacher and principal in West Virginia, Wisconsin, Illinois, New Jersey, and Minnesota. She served as a pastoral minister and worked with impoverished children in Jamaica, Appalachia, and the Hmong community in St. Paul. She was a member of the Servants of Mary Leadership Team and is a spiritual assistant to the Servite Confraternity of Our Lady of Sorrows.



A memory I have to share... The sixth-grade teacher in a school where I was principal assigned her students to write a persuasive letter. One student wrote to Minnesota Twins owner Carl Pohlad and dared him to come see all the Twins memorabilia in their classroom. Carl took the dare and arrived with Twins caps for everyone. He invited the whole school to the next Twins game and sent six buses to pick us up. We were paraded onto the infield at the Metrodome and greeted with signs blinking: "Welcome St. Jerome School – Maplewood."

Sr. Margaret (Mary Jane) Valois

was born in Chicago, Ill. She entered religious life on Oct. 15, 1948, and professed first vows on Aug. 16, 1950. She holds a BA in education from St. Catherine University, St. Paul, Minn., and an MA in education with a specialization in remedial reading from Duquesne University, Pittsburg, Pa. She ministered as an elementary school teacher for 47 years in Illinois,



Minnesota, New Jersey, West Virginia, and Wisconsin. She also served as a religious education teacher, vocation director for the Servants of Mary, and assistant with the TEC, Cursillo, and Fiat programs in several states and the Diocese of Superior. She is a spiritual assistant to Secular Servites and the Servite Lay Diakonia.

A memory I have to share... I recall putting on a play in 1984 depicting Christ's life: "He Lived the Good Life." The junior high students sang and danced the whole life of Jesus. The letters of thanks that I received from the students filled my heart with joy and love. With Mary, I can say, "He who is mighty has done great things for me. Holy is his name" (Luke 1:49).

Before bedtime we lined up outside in the dark of night for the final trip to the privy. Sr. Sandy led the way with a lit candle, intoning, "Lumen Christi," to which we responded, "Deo gratias." Each took her turn on the throne, and Sandy lighted our way back to the cabin. The Easter vigil has never been the same for me since.

Sr. Jeannine Percy was born in Chicago, Ill. She entered religious life on Aug. 30, 1958, and professed first vows on June 20, 1960. She holds a BS in psychology and Master of Religious Education from Loyola University Chicago, Master of Public Administration from the University of Colorado, and certifications in healthcare ministry sponsorship and governance. She ministered as an elementary and junior high teacher in Minnesota and Illinois and served in diocesan ministry in religious education, Catholic schools, and adult religious formation in

I was ready to follow her to China and become a Maryknoll! Instead my path took me to the Servite sisters in Ladysmith, and this was the fork in the road I thank God I did not miss.

A reflection I have to share... As I reflect on my 50 years as a Servite sister, I recall that I was once asked whether I entered to make my parents proud. A memory I have to share ... I remember a night at St. Mary's Hospital in Kewaunee. I was assisting in the birth of a baby. The only other staff working with me reported an elderly person died at the exact same minute as the baby was born. At age 28 I marveled that one human takes a first breath while another takes a last breath. This happens everyday somewhere on this planet!

In Memoriam

Sr. Mary John VanderLoop (1918–2020)

Sr. Mary John died on March 23, 2020, at Lake Manor in Ladysmith. She was 101.

She was born on a farm east of Ladysmith on June 5, 1918, to George and Alice Reynders Vander-Loop, the third of 13 children, and baptized Loretta Elizabeth. She had three brothers Paul, Theodore, and George, and eight sisters, Martina, Marie, Bernice (Sister Mary Bernice, OSM), Dorothy, Gertrude, Eunice, Audrey, Eileen, and Anne.

She attended Ladysmith High School and graduated as valedictorian in 1937. She studied at River Falls State Teachers College and earned a teaching certificate from Rusk County Normal School, an RN from St. Francis School of Nursing in La Crosse, and a BSN from the College of St. Scholastica in Duluth.



She entered the Servants of Mary on Feb. 10, 1941. She became a novice on Aug. 15, 1941, and received the name Sr. Mary John. She professed first vows on Aug. 14, 1942, and final vows on Aug. 15, 1948

She ministered as a teacher, nurse, director of nursing, hospital administrator, and social justice advocate, and served on the Servants of Mary leadership team for 13 consecutive years.

Sr. Mary Lucy Daniels (1925-2020)



Sr. Mary Lucy died on April 1, 2020, at Sacred Heart Hospital in Eau Claire, Wis. She was 95.

She was born on a farm west of Weyerhaeuser, Wis., on Feb. 14, 1925, to Anthony and Sophia Grzeszczyk Daniels, the first of 14 children, and baptized Dorothea Cecilia. She had nine sisters, Louise, Teresa, Kathleen, Dolores, Geraldine, Frances, Margaret, JoAnne, and Christine, and four brothers, Anthony, Richard, James, and Thomas.

She entered the Servants of Mary on Aug. 30, 1940. She became a novice on Aug. 15, 1941, and received the name Sister Mary Lucy. She professed first vows on Aug. 16, 1942, and final vows on Aug. 15, 1948.

She held a bachelor's degree from Mount Senario College in Ladysmith and a license in nursing home administration in Illinois. She did advanced work in gerontology and clinical pastoral education at St. Joseph Hospital in St. Paul, Minn.

She served as a teacher of piano and classroom music in Weirton, W.Va., director of postulants and novices in Ladysmith, administrator of Addolorata Villa, in Wheeling, Ill., and director of pastoral care at Rusk County Memorial Hospital and Nursing Home in Ladysmith.

Sr. Mary Damian Powers (1931–2020)

Sr. Mary Damian died on May 11, 2020, at Addolorata Villa in Wheeling, Ill. She was 88.

She was born in Chicago, Ill., on Nov. 13, 1931, to Patrick and Helen Skrupky Powers and baptized Theresa Ann. She had one sister, Rita, and three brothers, Edward, Patrick, and James.

She entered the Servants of Mary on Aug. 30, 1947. She became a novice on Aug. 15, 1948, and received the name Sr. Mary Damian. She professed first vows on Aug. 16, 1949, and final vows on 15, 1955.

She held a BA in medical technology from the College of St. Scholastica, Duluth, Minn., and was a certified chaplain in the National Association of Catholic Chaplains.

She served as a medical technologist at hospitals in Ladysmith and Kewanee, Wis., and a pastoral minister at Our Lady of Sorrows Basilica, Chicago. She spent close to 30 years in Dorchester, Mass., ministering as a pastoral associate, visitor to the sick and elderly, and coordinator of a food pantry.

Sr. Marie Rubbelke (1938–2020)

Sr. Marie died on May 29, 2020, at Cerenity Marian in St. Paul, Minn. She was 82.

She was born in St. Paul, Minn., on Feb. 10, 1938, to John and Agnes Wolf Rubbelke, the sixth of eight children, and baptized Agnes Marie. She had two sisters, Margaret and Colleen, and five brothers, Robert, Jerome, John, Richard, and Michael.

She joined the Servants of Mary as an aspirant in her junior year in high school in 1954 and became a postulant on Aug. 19, 1956. She was received as a novice on June 19, 1957, and given the name Sr. Mary Cabrini. She later returned to her middle name, Marie. She professed first vows on June 20, 1958, and final vows on June 19, 1964.

She studied nursing and clinical pastoral education in Milwau-kee and held an LPN license in Wisconsin and Minnesota. She pursued theological studies in Michigan, Missouri, and Pennsylvania. She studied cosmetology in St. Paul and was a licensed cosmetologist.

She ministered as an elementary school teacher, nurse, and cosmetologist, and worked with the homebound elderly. She volunteered with the American Red Cross, Catholic Charities, Head Start, Dorothy Day Center, St. Paul Children's Museum, and Portage Home Hospice.

We Never Know Whose Life We May Touch

Last April I received a pleasant request from Nathaly Martinez, a sophomore at San Diego Catholic High School in Austin, Texas. Nathaly was working on a research project in theology that required her to learn about a particular religious order. She discovered our community's website and was impressed by what she read. Coming upon my personal story of why I entered the Servites, she decided to reach out to

What I found most humbling is that she was inspired by my story. Who knew that a story written some years ago would be inspiring to a student in a high school theology class today! I guess we never know how we can touch someone's life without ever meeting her.

Nathaly asked me to answer two questions. "First," she asked, "are you required to wear the habit on a daily basis or any sort of attire in particular?"

I told her that when I first joined we were in full required habit, which I wore for about nine years. When the changes came in the 1960s we went through a few gradual changes. Those that preferred the full habit were given that choice, as was the case when we decided to wear the common dress of the day by the late 60s and early 70s. No one in our community is currently wearing any formal religious attire. We dress modestly and sensibly, with the choice of attire up to the discretion of each individual.

"My second question," said Nathaly, "is related more to you and your journey in particular. I was very inspired by your story. I know you already gave us an insight about your journey in that brief article you wrote, but I just wanted to ask if any of these feelings have changed throughout the years or have instead strengthened."

I told her that this June I would be completing my 60th year as a Servite sister. During these years I have not lost my enthusiasm and joy as part of the Servite

Order. My sisters – there are fewer of us now – continue to be my support, and I love them dearly. Being part of a group of women means that we have our differences but are always able

I ended by telling Nathaly that it was great to be challenged by her questions, which I answered thoughtfully and honestly. And Nathaly, in her own way, has inspired me.

Thanks, Nathaly, for reminding me to continue touching the hearts of those who know me or that I pass along the way, not realizing how I may have helped make their lives a bit better.


